YAS Goals

- Create opportunities to educate others
- Guide people to places and tools that can help them stay safe online
- Listen and build trust with schoolmates
- Be a bridge between students and school staff

YAS Values

- Act with care and respect towards others
- Be inclusive and welcoming
- Be aware of factors like age, gender, sexual orientation, culture and ethnicity
- Do what you say you'll do
- Be discreet when talking to your squad about individuals. Don't use names
- Don't share private information with anyone outside of the squad, school staff or Netsafe

YAS Safety

- Know your personal boundaries and what you can and can't do as a YAS leader
- Don't feel you need to solve other people's problems alone. Support is always available
- Refer regularly to the Green, Orange and Red stages in the Support section of the YAS website to assess the situations of the young people you're helping
- Know what support options are out there for you and others
- Don't promise to keep a secret if it may harm someone else or yourself
- Check in with your fellow squad leaders regularly to offer and receive support and advice
